A Savile Row tailor shows us how to get that Don Draper look

Yes, it can be tricky ... so an expert tells STYLE how you can smarten up and look the part in a well-cut two-piece suit



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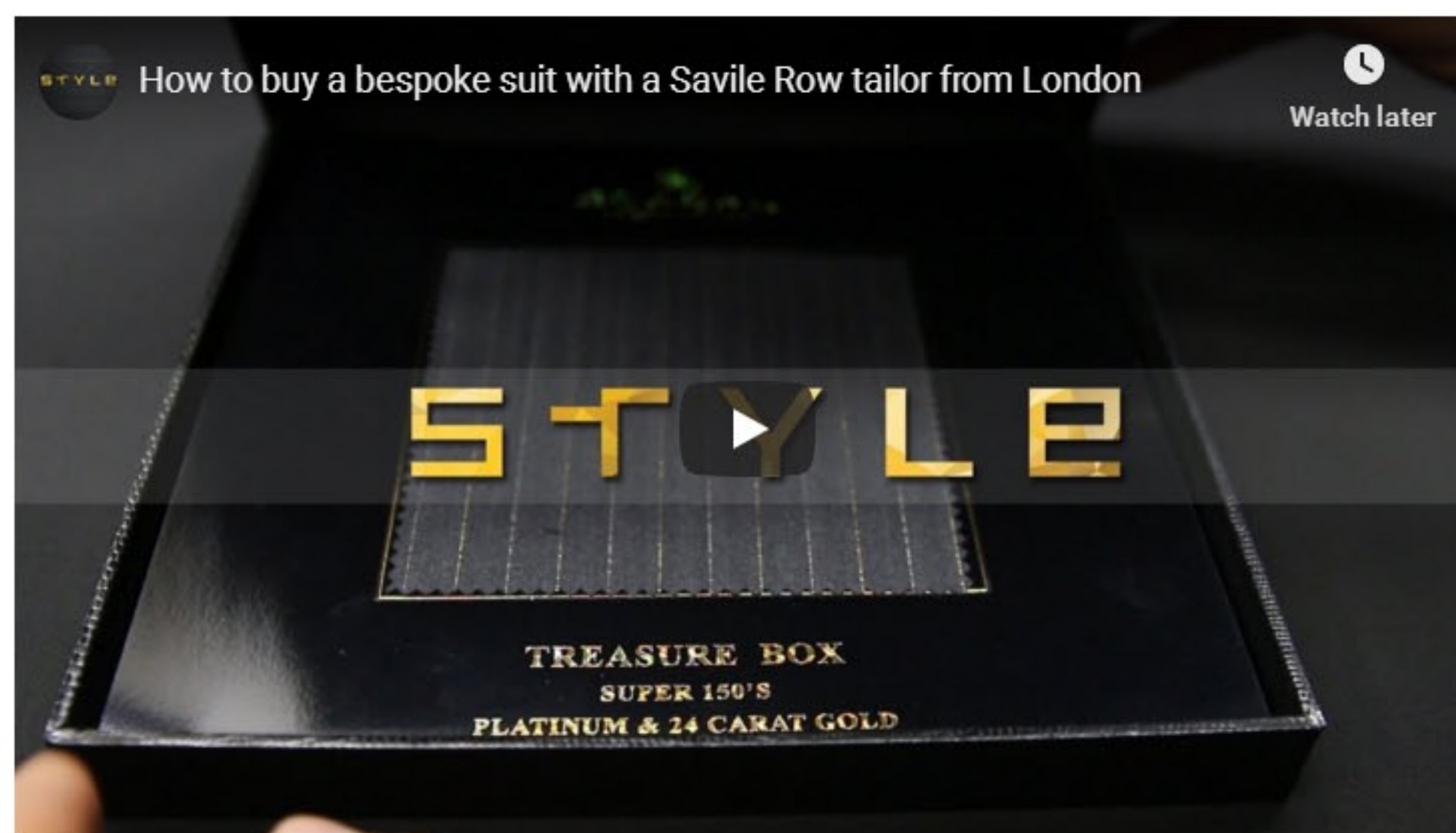
Dashing Don Draper, played by actor John Hamm, in one of his signature fine-cut suits from the 1960s-set television series, *Mad Men*. Photo: AMC
